Read the chart below to understand how your project will be scored. Your goal should be to earn all 20 possible points.

<b>Situation</b>	Project fully tells a strong story and clearly shows why the day was seen as good.	Project tells a complete story and gives a hint of why the day was good. <b>Characters</b>	Story has at least two characters who are clearly different from each other.	Story has two characters, and at least one is clearly described.	Story has one character that the reader can understand.	Story does not include any characters.
<b>Setting</b>	Story gives a vivid picture of where it took place.	Story describes where it took place.	Story states where it took place.	Story does not say where it took place.
<b>Plot and time words</b>	Story has a strong beginning, middle, and end. Story tells what happened, and time words are often used to show the order of events.	Story has a beginning, middle, and end. Story tells what happened and where it happened. Time words are sometimes used to show the order of events.	Story tells some things that happened but is not clear about where it happened. Few time words used. Some are used incorrectly.	It is hard to know what happened or where. Time words are not used.
<b>Word choice</b>	Story gives a very strong idea of what characters say, do, think, and feel.	Story gives a clear idea of what characters say, do, think, and feel.	Story tells what characters say, do, think, and feel.	Story is not clear as to what characters say, do, think, and feel.
